Sea Turtle Nesting Season

Outer Banks sea turtle nesting season is May through September.

How can you help?

- Reduce lighting at night. Turn off ocean-facing lights or close drapes. Use wildlife-friendly red flashlights on the beach.
- Fill in holes and level sandcastles at the end of the day of play.
- Remove beach furniture each evening.
- •Keep balloons, plastic bags, and other trash off the beach and out of the ocean.
- •If you see a turtle on the beach, give it plenty of space and call the N.E.S.T. hotline. If you see a turtle at night, keep lights off and call N.E.S.T. A female that is disturbed may not lay her eggs.
